# Important June dates in 1778

Jun 1 - Engagement at Cobleskill NY

Jun 18 - The British evacuated Philadelphia when the French fleet reached the Delaware River. Jun 26 - Washington gave Gen. Charles Lee orders to attack the British rear guard at Monmouth NJ, but they were ignored by Lee.

Jun 28 - At the battle of Monmouth NJ Washington turns defeat into victory and orders Gen. Lee off the field. Jun 28 - Engagement at Freehold Courthouse NJ

Jun 30 - Gen. Charles Lee is relieved of command and brought up for a courtmartial.

### The Battle of Cobleskill

The Battle of Cobleskill also known as the Cobleskill massacre was an <u>American Revolutionary War</u> raid on the frontier settlement of <u>Cobleskill, New York</u> on May 30, 1778. The battle marked the beginning of a phase in which <u>Loyalists</u> and <u>Iroquois</u>, encouraged and supplied by British authorities in <u>Province of Quebec</u>, raided and destroyed numerous villages on what was then the United States western frontier of New York and Pennsylvania.

A small party of Iroquois entered Cobleskill and drew the local militia defenders into a trap set by a much larger party of Iroquois and Loyalists under the command of <u>Joseph Brant</u>. After killing a number of the militia and driving off the remainder, Brant's forces destroyed much of the settlement.
